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Unlike Norway, most countries have very **low trust** in government, political parties, religious organisations, media, and businesses.

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The European Union's Agency for Fundamental Rights (FRA) definition:

"Civic space is the environment that enables people and groups to participate meaningfully in the political, economic, social and cultural life in their societies. Vibrant civic space requires an open, secure and safe environment that is free from all acts of intimidation, harassment and reprisals, whether online or offline."



Civic space is under systematic and sustained attack from government legislation, commercial control, and, alarmingly, from self censorship.



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Cultural organisations are the stewards of increasingly valuable and important civic space. What we choose to do next will influence the fate of democracy.



Based on the expert estimates and index by the Economist Intelligence Unit (2006-2024). It ranges from 0 to 10 (most liberties).



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

Distribution of Democrats and Republicans on a 10-item scale of political values


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


67% believe culture deserves more funding from the Swedish government.
